

## **Calvert Memorial Fund Capital Improvements**

*Tonight we celebrate our past and present accomplishments.  
We would like to highlight all the projects completed to date.*

### **1999**

Entire building's electrical capacity was upgraded to accommodate 21st century needs, technology, computers, business office operations, new business systems and new lighting systems, both indoor and outdoor.

### **2000**

A full service kitchen was constructed.

### **2001**

Entire facility was converted to accommodate community members with special needs by expanding toilet facilities both for indoor and outdoor use. The facility went from 5 to 15 toilets, a dozen sinks, new staff restroom, drinking fountains, and new ceilings, floors, paint, doorways, fire alarm and security alarm.

### **2002**

Preschool classroom environment and large multipurpose room were renovated.

### **2003**

Renovation of the entire outside facility was completed to include adding a universally accessible playground (the only one in the Inland Empire), tetherball court, handball court, volleyball court, new soccer court flooring, bleachers, barbecue area, basketball courts, gardening area, a one-of-a-kind water/sound/texture wall, new landscaping, and a new irrigation system.

### **2004**

The YMCA received a donation of two mini buses for the after school transportation program. The YMCA was able to refurbish both buses completely to use for youth bus transportation.

### **2005**

The YMCA Youth Center at City Park was opened in October 2005. The program offers services absolutely free to 72 preschool children. Three sessions run daily for three hours each. The program is funded through a grant from the State Department of Education. In addition, a new Preschool classroom was added to the main YMCA (Marsha's Preschool). Also added were a new lobby, new conference room, public restroom, and a renovated staff workroom.

### **2006**

The Community Center in Home Gardens opened, serving seniors in the mornings and middle and high school students in the afternoons. The center was made possible through a partnership with the Riverside County Library System,

Riverside County Fire Department and Second District County Supervisor John Tavaglione.

**2007**

The YMCA was able to purchase two stationary permanent shade structures for the main Y facility backyard. The structure will cover all the wheelchair-accessible picnic tables. Renovation and repair work was completed at our City Park locations, adding preschool-sized toilets, sinks, drinking fountains, carpet, linoleum, flooring and replacement panels on the ADA accessible ramps.

**2008**

Youth Center at Harada Elementary school. Licensed child care site offers supervised activities for children Kinder – 6th Grade. Transportation provided to and from Clara Barton, Rosa Parks, Sierra Vista and Riverview Elementary Schools. (Program fees are based on weekly rates.)

**2009**

In January 2009, the Y was awarded \$550K from the State Dept. of Education to open additional State Preschool slots doubling our program size from 92 to 192. In April, we partnered with Hope through Housing to open an additional site to add a drop-in afterschool program to Corona Del Oro Affordable Housing Complex. In June 2009, an expansion and renovation project was completed at the YMCA Community Center in Home Gardens to add additional square footage for our teen programs, complete with a computer lab.

**2010**

The YMCA was able to renovate and resurface flooring in our outdoor soccer stadium located at the Main Y on River Road. The entire project had many components removing old flooring, ground prep work preparing cement, sanding down and painting the interior and exterior of the arena, adding 9,227 square feet of artificial outdoor field turf, replacing arena doorways. The entire project costs \$61.894
